ACT ON CLIMATE

Climate change is one of the biggest threats we are facing currently and we are already seeing the impacts here at home. Given the pressing need for climate action, what will you do to ensure Washington state is a climate leader and is investing in clean energy over dirty energy?

EQUITY AND JUST TRANSITION OF WORKERS

As Washington works to address climate change and become a clean energy leader what will you do to ensure that these communities benefit from the new clean energy economy? What kinds of training programs for workers are you advocating for to create a just transition?

OIL SPILL PREVENTION

People in Washington state love Puget Sound and so many of us rely on it for our livelihoods. Yet our communities and waterways face a continued threat from oil spills. Our oil spill programs are drastically underfunded and aren't prepared for the new threats we face. Will you commit to fully funding these programs and protect Washington from oil spills by supporting legislation such as Senate Bill 6269?

ACTION FOR TOXIC-FREE FOOD PACKAGING

Widespread use of toxic, cancer causing, chemicals in consumer products such as food packaging is a serious health concern for myself and many Washingtonians. What will you do to ensure that Washingtonians food, health, and environment are protected from threat?
